



Dreiser - Shadows of Meaning

Would you like to do another drawing? If so, try this:

Look around you outside, how do shadows change during a day? How different are they on a cloudy or a sunny day? This sculpture has sentences in it and the letters sometimes cast shadows on the ground. On a sunny day when you can be outside, put an object on a plain piece of paper and draw the shadow's **form** on the paper.
