Would you like to do another drawing? If so, try this:

This is a tricky sculpture because it looks like it is a continuous arch but, the sculpture is on two different planes that do not meet. Using **color** how can you show something in front of another thing in a drawing? For example, bright **colors** in a painting can look like they are closer to you than darker or duller **colors**. Try it out and see how you can use color to show space.
